The pot represents the tradition of great generosity of the Loyola family, who after feeding family, retainers and soldiess, had enough or the wolves to feed on the leftover: Lobo-y-olla is a play on the family name Loyola.

- 3. Intellectually competent


B.) Profile of the Ignatian educator 1. Animates the Ignatian vision

As a Catholic school in Belize St. John's College serves the Diocese of Belize City and Belmopan in which it is situated. St. John's College has a history of 130 years of service to the country. This history shows that over the years St. John's College, in the Jesuit tradition, has gone beyond the bounds of traditional education to offer new approaches to secondary and tertiary education. Payment Procedures

The College policy on tuition and fee payment requires that registration for classes be finalized only after ALL tuition and fees are paid. You are therefore reminded that registration is not complete until ALL tuition and fees are paid. This requirement and the accompanying procedures are explained below.

During registration, the Finance Office, through the Office of the Registrar, will issue you an SJC pro-forma invoice for payment. Payment for registration must be made at any branch of Atlantic Bank or Belize Bank countrywide. When paying, you must present the SJC pro-forma invoice to the bank teller. The pro-forma invoice contains the amount to be paid, your name, and your assigned student ID number. The bank teller will record all this information for proper processing of your payment. Please ensure that the receipt you obtain from the bank has the ID number and name, as is reflected on the pro-forma invoice. You are advised payments for your own record keeping.

If you do not make payment within the specified time frame, your registration will be cancelled. When your registration is cancelled, the space reserved for you in the particular classes you had registered will be made available to other students. Tuition & Fees and Registration Please note that registration is not considered complete

until students have paid full tuition and fees. Full tuition and fees, or the first installment on the payment plan, must be made no later than the posted dates. Students who do not pay full tuition and fees or make appropriate arrangements by the dates indicated will have their registration cancelled and will be blocked from receiving transcripts of grades, copies of diplomas, letters of recommendations or credit at the SJC bookstore.

The pro-forma invoice issued at registration is a preliminary invoice. Any adjustments to your bill for any changes made during the drop/add period will be made thereafter, and a new pro-forma invoice will be issued for the adjusted balance. You may at any time request a statement from the Finance Office.

If you (and your parents, if they are responsible for your tuition and fees) need to make arrangements for payto save the pro-forma invoice and bank receipt of ment as allowed through the college payment plan system, you must make these arrangements with the finance officer within the time frame set by the Finance Office.

Tuition Assistance and Reimbursement

Students whose employers, the Government of Belize, or any other sponsoring organizations have made arrangements with St. John's College Finance Office to pay tuition and fees or costs of books should bring a signed letter of commitment from the sponsor to the Finance Office no later than five business days after pre-registration. If the sponsor's commitment does not provide for full payment, the student is required to appropriately settle the balance (either by paying the balance or using the payment plan system). All students who receive a scholarship after having paid at the time of registration will be reimbursed upon graduating.

Students who withdraw from classes no later than the last day of the official drop/add period set by the Office of the Registrar will receive a refund of full tuition and fees. Students who officially withraw from classes within the first three weeks of the semester are refunded 1/3 tuition only. No refunds are made after this time.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

Students receiving financial assistance from St. John's College must consult with the Associate Dean for Student Affairs to verify their financial assistance package. Students must have a current, approved SJC Financial Aid commitment or scholarship on file at the time of registration before any financial assistance can be applied to the payment of tuition and fees.

Students in their first year who passed six or more of the CSEC examinations, including English A and Mathematics, and are Belizeans by birth or nationality, must submit a copy of their CSEC results along with their social security card at the Finance Office to receive a tuition scholarship from the Government of Belize. To maintain the scholarship, students must earn a G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher per semester. Students are responsible for all other fees and cost of books.

The Government of Belize provides tuition scholarships for students in their second year at the Junior College, as long as they achieve a successful pass in their first semester and a G.P.A. of 2.5 or above in their second semester. The Finance Office requires that students wishing to access the tuition scholarship complete a Second Year tuition form provided by the Finance Office.

CXC SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Students who are awarded CXC scholarships must submit a copy of their CSEC results to the Finance Office no later than September 15, 2023 in order for the Ministry of Education to be billed on their behalf. Payments already made will be credited to these students' accounts once the corresponding payments have been received from the Government of Belize. Students must maintain a GPA of 2.50 or above to continue to enjoy this assistance.

LANDIVAR SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

St. John's College Junior College offers financial assistance through Landivar Scholarships to make tertiary education available to qualified young men and women in Belize. Application forms for Landivar Scholarships are available from the Student Services Office and on the school's website. Students must apply for the scholarship each semester in which assistance is sought. The deadline for the aplication is June 23, 2023.

Academic Probation

When a student earns below a 2.00 in any semester, he/she is placed on academic probation. This means that the student must sign a contract and improve his/her grades to be able to continue at the College. Students on academic probation are given fewer courses until their grades improve and are not allowed to withdraw without approval from the Dean. After any 2 semesters on academic probation (including summer, if enrolled), a student may be dismissed from the college.

Credit Hours

This is the number of hours per week that a student meets for a course or program. Most students will take six courses every semester, and most courses meet for three hours per week. The average student is in class eighteen hours per week. This means that students have a lot of "free-time"; encourage them to use this time wisely.

Honors

Students who earn a GPA of 3.00 to 3.49 are placed on Honor Roll. Students who earn a GPA of 3.50 to 4.00 are placed on the Dean's List. Both groups of students are honored at assemblies and at graduation.

Course Placement

An incoming student may be required to take one or more remedial courses, such as MTH 100/101, CHE 100/101, or ENG 100/101. Such students may subsequently require an additional semester or summer session to complete his/her program.

The Registration Process

Registration for students accepted to St. John's College Junior College will take place in the month of June, on dates scheduled in the Academic Calendar. Each full-time student is assigned a faculty academic advisor who will assist him/her in selecting courses. Academic advisors make every attempt to give effective guidance on course selection and academic program requirements to students and to refer them to other College resources for help in other matters. However, the final responsibilities for meeting all academic requirements and registering for the appropriate courses for a selected program rest with the student.

The registration process entitles selecting courses, enrolling in those courses, and paying the relevant tuition and fees. Once courses are selected and students have signed up for a set of courses for the semester, a preliminary invoice will be issued and payments must be made at the designated bank within the time frame specified in the academic calendar. The registration process is complete only when all tuition and fees are paid.

Academic Advising

Academic advising at the Junior College is intended to provide ongoing help in the transition from secondary to tertiary level and to help students stay on track in the program to which they have been admitted. Students are encouraged to study the academic programs to which they have been admitted and to thoroughly familiarize themselves with academic requirements and procedures.

Drop/Add

A student may drop or add a course without penalty on his/her academic record within the first week of the semester, known as the Drop/Add period. After this point, the student may withdraw from a course without academic penalty up until the last Thursday before the start of final examinations. Drop/Add and Withdrawal forms can be found in the Academic Bulletin or on the website.

Abacus

This is an educational management platform for teachers, students and parents at SJCJC with real-time online access. Both parents and students receive their access code from the Dean.

Graduation

Students must apply for graduation, even when they do not plan to participate in commencement exercises. All degree requirements must be 100% complete before the scheduled Commencement Exercises in order for a student to be eligible to participate and for degree conferral.

Personal Development Record

In addition to the academic transcript, the college also records students' participation in extracurricular activities, community service, leadership positions and conduct.

GPA | the Grade Point Average

Is a score from 0.00 to 4.00 that a student earns at the end of each semester. It can be interpreted as follows:

3.75 to 4.00 = A 3.50 to 3.74 = B+ 3.00 to 3.49 = B 2.50 to 2.99 = C+ 2.00 to 2.49 = C 1.00 to 1.99 = D

0.00 to 0.99 = F

Our classes run from 8:00 a.m. until 8:15 p.m. to accommodate working individuals.

Student Code of Conduct

Dress Code

Students are required to adhere to the prevailing standards of good judgment in their choice of attire and are expected to conduct themselves in a way that best represents themselves and the college. Below are some guidelines:

- Dresses, skirts, and trousers must fall below the knee. Absolutely no cut up jeans for females or males.
- · Shirts, blouses, and dresses must have sleeves. Strapped, strapless, halter top, low-cut, tank tops, and undershirts used as outer-wear are not allowed.

Requirements for the **Associate Degree**

- 1) Pass all courses with a grade of C or above.
- 2) Achieve a cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.00 for all courses at the Junior College.
- 3) Complete at the Junior College a minimum of sixty percent (60%) of the credit hours required for the degee.
- 4) Transfer no more than a maximum of thirty (30) credit hours of study from other institutions (with approval).
- 5) Complete and submit an Application for Degree Completion by the date set on the official SJCJC Calendar.
- 6) Fulfill all financial and other obligations to the College before graduation.
- 7) Complete one hundred (100) hours of community service.
